As a Psychology student, you will...

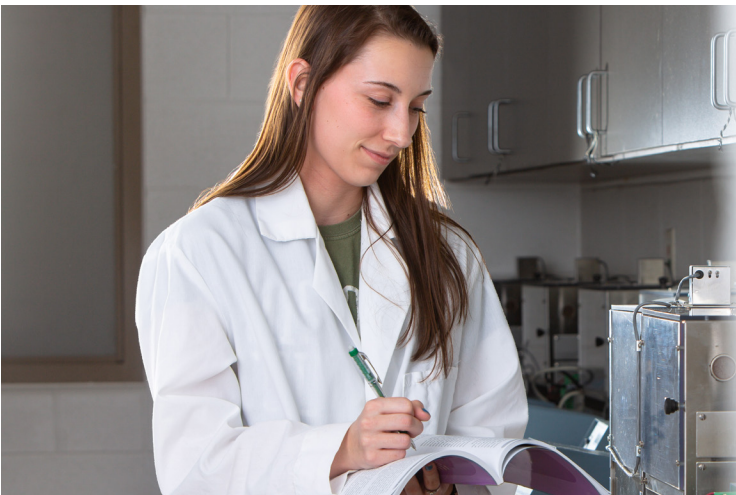
